In two separate incidents involving cars in road traffic accidents where the airbag deployed, the force of the airbag caused: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• the ID holder on the lanyard to be pushed into the chest causing a collapsed lung;</li> <li>• the keys on the lanyard to penetrate the body and perforate the bowel.</li> </ul> The risk applies equally to travelling in any vehicle at any time, but from an Academy perspective, the simple action of removing lanyards while travelling is something we need to implement immediately to assure driver and passenger safety under our duty of care.

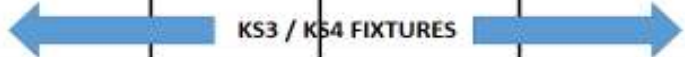
