


## Submitting work on Satchel One

**Jealousy in Othello**

Iago first suggests the idea of jealousy to Othello in Act 3, Scene III. From there, jealousy concentrates Othello's mind so completely on one idea - the idea that Desdemona has betrayed him with Cassio - that he can entertain no other assurance or explanation. This obsession totally removes Othello's ability to reason, his common sense, and his respect for justice. It is only once he has killed Desdemona and realises that she was innocent that he recovers.

Write an essay that investigates and discusses Othello's jealousy and Iago's role in this. How does Othello's character change when he is overcome with jealousy?
